Druids of Germany – more than 150 years celebrated.



Earlier this year in the German magazine "Druidenstern" the celebration of the first 150 year of Druidism in Germany was nicely covered with pictures and highlights. The editors of IGLD News think this was a milestone and therefore we like to bring some of this to all druids as a reminder of our long, lasting brotherhood and our World Wide connection.

As we know it was in 1781 the Druid Order was founded in London. The political, religious and social conditions were so incomplete and unsatisfactory that idealistic minded men saw in this in their own living conditions. The basis for this was the Age of Enlightenment. Today our work and way of thinking is still committed to their ideals: freedom of thought, humility, tolerance and respect for human dignity. To stand up for this is the goal and the way for our unification. We still strive for moral and ethical ideals and want to realize this in everyday life through human actions. Druids of today stand for fraternity, charity, justice and a friendly life of all people.

This was the main frame of the 150

We Druids also know how to celebrate and great thanks to all the Brothers involved in the preparations and implementation. All the well-planned work gave all participants an unforgettable celebration.

I.G.L.D. - meeting in Vejle



On Saturday October 28, 2023, a meeting of I.G.L.D. (International Grand Lodge of Druidism) was announced at Logen Camelot's premises in Vejle.

On this Saturday in October, 55 brothers from Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Germany, and Denmark had gone to Vejle to participate in this meeting, where no less than 14 recipients knocked on the door to be accepted into this international degree.

The officials, led by President Jan Moosmand, made a dignified and solemn admission of the 14 recipients, whom three had made the trip from Iceland to Veile to be admitted to I.G.L.D.

After the solemn admission, Grand Treasurer Per-Arne Meijgren gave a status to I.G.L.D. and mentioned, among other things, that the 30th World Congress would be held in Stavanger, Norway in

2024.

Vice President of Denmark René Corvinius reported for Denmark in which he mentioned that there were 248 brothers in Denmark, but work was being done on PR initiatives to get an influx of brothers. Several of the lodges in Denmark had made fine donations to various organizations.

The ideal speech of the night should have been conducted by Rigs Old Ærk Harry Hansen, Logen Sirius, Br. Harry had unfortunately fallen into disrepair, instead his speech was read by Ring Brother Kevin Refvik, Lodge Sirius.

The speech dealt with the travails of the external world, which can also take its place in our lodges, and each time to irreparable damage and what disappointments and doubts in relation





to our fellow brethren it can give.

After the conclusion of the lodge meeting, the brethren gathered for a fraternal meal in the after-lodge. Here the brothers spent a few enjoyable hours talking to the new I.G.L.D. brothers, along with a menu

consisting of the obligatory red and white Herrings and with Kale with brown/white potatoes and ham/Sausages. It was a memorable day for everyone.

After several years of preparation, it was time to found a new Riksstorlodje in Iceland. There is a lot of good and time-consuming work behind this historic event, and brothers from Germany, Australia, USA, Sweden, Denmark, Norway and Iceland wouldwitness this

On Thursday 25 February it was time for the foundation of a newNational Grand Lodge in Iceland. Work with own Riksstorlodjein Iceland started in 2018. After a significant effort byour Icelandic brothers and the Norwegian Druid Order were the dayfinally arrived. The meeting was ritually opened at 14.00 in the premises of the Freemasons' lodge, by Storlosje Isafold at SEE Gêtar Ârnason. Onthe meeting was attended by 170 brothers from Germany, Australia, the USA, Sweden, Denmark, Norway and Iceland, in addition to the Grandmasters from itlcelandic and the Norwegian Masonic Order.On the agenda was the dissolution of Storlosje Isafold andestablishment of the new Riksstorloje in Iceland. RSEE Geir-Kåre Jordheim with his officials entered Lunden and announced that the Norwegian Riksstorembetsmenni had invented upon application from Grand Lodgelsafold and lodges Janus, Fjølnir, Geysir and Gaia, about the creation of a new Grand National Order at Iceland, RSEE Geir-Kåre Jordheim stated that it was a big onepleasure to be able to fulfill this wish. This would benefit and strengthen the Druidic work. He then requested the Icelandic officials in Storlojelsafold to leave their seats. The retired officials were solemnly awarded their ex-regaliaand the Norwegian officials subsequently took over the offices in Lunden.

Grand Lodge Isafold's Druidic flame became extinguished and the new one that had been brought from Norway was lit.RSEE then asked that the meeting be opened as a National Assembly. It was voted on the Law of Order and committee and new members was chosen.

A UNIQUE GIFT



Carved Maori Shield

CARVED MAORI SHIELD A handsome carved shield, the work of Henare Toka, of Taiporohenui, is to be seen in Mr. A. E. Wainwright's window just now. The shield is to be donated by the Maori brethren of the Star of Egmont Lodge of Druids, Patea to the Grand Lodge of England for ritual competition. The centre of the shield is a symbolic representation of Matangirei, the house of the great tupuna (ancestor) Turi, of the Aotea Canoe.

The design of the carving is known as Una Unahi, or the scales of a sea monster. This is the fish Te Parata, into whose greedy throat the Aotea Canoe nearly sank during her historic voyage. Una unahi typifies the dangers of the world. With plain border inset with pawa shells is Matangirei; above the house the design Mata.kupenga, shows the meshes of the fishing net. Herein lies the meaning of the shield. Though the dangers of this world surround us, those who come within the meshes of the Druids' net find safety in the house built by the men of the olden time

A carved representation of an ancient Druid completes the shield. Lightly indicated on his shoulders is a Maori cloak such as a chief would wear."

MAORI SHIELD APPRECIATED - Members of the local Lodge of Druids will be glad to learn that the handsome carved shield which was presented by the Maori members of the Lodge to the Grand Lodge of England, was duly presented to the Grand Lodge delegates at the International conference held at Hull recently. In conversation with a representative of the "Press" Mr. Ramsbottom stated that the gift was greatly appreciated not only by members of the Grand Lodge, but also by the delegates who were present from all parts of the world. The gift was regarded by all present as a gesture of goodwill from the Maoris to the Motherland. The shield was immediately insured and placed for safe custody in a vault in London in company with the documents and other articles of value belonging to the Grand Lodge. The shield will be displayed at each annual conference in future, and also at each quinquennial International Conference of the Order.
